Net Current Asset Value. What is the definition of NCAV? NCAV equals the companies current assets minus its total liabilities. This gives an additional margin of safety versus book value - on this valuation measure, one is essentially paying nothing for all the fixed assets (buildings, machinery, etc0, or any goodwill items that may exist.

Net Asset Value – NAV Definition

Net asset value is the value of a fund’s assets minus any liabilities and expenses. The NAV (on a per-share basis) represents the price at which investors can buy or sell units of the fund. When the value of the securities in the fund increases, the NAV increases.

Net Asset Value - Definition, Formula, and How to Interpret

The formula is: Net Current Asset Value (NCAV) = cash and short-term investments + (0.75 \* accounts receivable) + (0.5 \* inventory) – total liabilities – preferred stock The resulting value can then be divided by the number of common shares outstanding to find the NCAV per share.

Net current asset value, NCAV, criteria: Buying shares at a price below the net current asset value. NCAV is balance sheet current assets minus all the liabilities (both short- and long-term). Long-term assets are generally to be counted at zero value.

Price to NCAV compares the current price to the Net Current Asset Value which equals the companies current assets minus its total liabilities.

Divided the calculated NCAV with the 'number of shares outstanding'. The value you get is called Net Current Asset Value Per Share (NCAVPS). This is the intrinsic value. Compare it with current price of the company to know if stock is undervalued or overvalued.

Net Current Asset Value Formula. NCAV = Current Assets – Total Liabilities. The value of the current assets on the balance sheet tends to be very close to the market value of these assets. The total liability value is also very close to what the company actually owes to its creditors.

Net Current Asset Value = Current Assets – (Current Liabilities + Long-Term Liabilities) \$50,000 – (\$10,000 + \$10,000) = \$30,000 2. Then, by dividing by the number of shares, we arrive at the NCAVPS.

The net current asset value per share (NCAVPS) equals a company's current assets divided by its number of shares outstanding. How Does Net Current Asset Value Per Share (NCAVPS) Work? The formula for NCAVPS is: NCAVPS = (Current Assets - Current Liabilities) / Shares Outstanding
